$$MD = TD * \Pi_{military2total} \tag{1}$$

where MD is the number of military dolphins, TD is the number of total dolphins in the oceans and rivers, and $\Pi_{military2total}$ is the ratio of military to total dolphins.

Current estimates put this in the range of 100 – 200 military dolphins. See Figure 1 for an example of a dolphin being used by the military.
